1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology (Society) was set up in the year 1982 by Govt. of India as an autonomous body for coordinated growth and development of hospitality management education in the country. Initially, the Council was set up in the name of National Board of Studies in Food Management, Catering & Nutrition under the administrative control of Ministry of Agriculture (Deptt. Of Food) and subsequently it was transferred to Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India in the year 1984 with renaming as National Council for Hotel Management & Catering Technology. The office of the Council is situated at A-34, Sector-62, Noida (U.P.) in its own building whereas registered office is at Pusa, New Delhi. The Council regulates academics in the field of Hospitality Education & training that is imparted at the 21 (twenty one) Central Govt. sponsored Institutes of Hotel Management, 17 (seventeen) State Govt. sponsored IHMs (14 SIHMs offering Degree Program & 3 SIHM offering Diploma Courses), 15 (Fighteen) private Institutes and 10 Food Craft Institutes that function in different parts of the country. Through the Council, these institutes offer Ten (10) different professional programmes leading to award of Certificate, Diploma, Post Graduate Diploma, Bachelor and Master Degree. (The last two programs are in collaboration with Indira Gandhi National Open University).

2. AIMS & OBJECTIVES AND ROLE OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL:

- 2.1 Aims and objectives of National Council for Hotel Management & Catering Technology and its role as the apex formation in the country to ensure co-ordinated growth and development of hospitality education through its affiliated institutes are elaborated in its Memorandum of Association which among other things, mandates the Council to effectively discharge functions such as:
- Formulate, guide and coordinate various types of studies, knowledge and research inclusive of Graduate and Post Graduate studies in the field of Food Management, Hotel Management, Catering Technology and Applied Nutrition and allied skills and crafts;
- b. Affiliate Institutions concerned with the subject and prescribe course of study and instructions leading to examinations conducted by it;
- c. Prescribe standards for buildings and equipment for affiliated institutes;
- d. Prescribe educational qualifications and other standards for faculty and members of staff of affiliated institutes and, where necessary depute them for further training, both within and outside the country.
- e. Prescribe educational and other qualifications for admission of students to various courses and prescribe manner of admission of students of different courses at the affiliated institutes;
- f. Admit candidates to examinations conducted by it;
- g. Conduct annual examinations for promotion from lower to higher classes and terminal examinations for award of Certificates, Diplomas and Degrees as prescribed for different courses:
- h. Publish results of examinations conducted by it:
- I. Grant Certificates, Diplomas and Degrees to students who have completed and passed the prescribed course of study and examination conducted by it;



- j. Co-operate with other authorities and bodies in such manner and for such purposes as may be necessary for giving effect to the objects of the Society;
- k. Promote general advancement of hospitality education, technical or otherwise, amongst members of and those connected with educational and professional interests of the hotel and catering industry;
- I. Form Rules and Bye-laws to devise and impose means for testing qualifications of persons already working in the industry with a view to grant recognition to their professional attainments and deal with all matters incidental thereto;
- m. Advise the Government on coordinated development of Hotel Management and Catering Technology education and training and on such other matters as the Govt. may require;
- n. Do all other such lawful acts and things as may be necessary or incidental or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objects of the Society;
- Acquire, hold and dispose of property in any manner whatsoever, subject to prior approval of the Central Government being obtained in the case of acquisition or disposal of immovable property;
- p. Deal with any property belonging to or vested in the Society in such manner as the Society may deem fit for advancing its functions;
- q. Borrow and raise money with or without security or the security of any mortgage, hypothecation or pledge of the overall or any part of the immovable properties belonging to the Society or in any other manner whatsoever;
- r. Print, publish and exhibit magazines, periodicals, newspapers, books, pamphlets or posters that may be considered desirable for the promotion of the objects of the Society;
- s. Receive grants-in-aid, donations, etc. from the Govt. and, if considered necessary, from other persons and utilise the grants etc. so received solely for furtherance of the objects of the Society and in accordance with any conditions therefore imposed by the Government;
- t. Create and maintain a fund to which shall be credited:
- I) All moneys provided to the Society by Government of India and other Governments/Institutions;
- ii) All fees and other charges received by the Society;
- iii) All moneys received by the Society by way of grants, gifts, donations bequests or transfers, and
- iv) All moneys received by the Society in any other manner or from any other source.
- v) Deposit all moneys into the fund created and maintain them in banks or invest them in such manner as the Society may decide;
- u. Draw, make, accept endorse and discount cheques, notes or other negotiable instruments, and for these purposes sign execute and deliver such assurances/deeds as may be necessary;
- v. Pay out of the funds belonging to the Society or out of any particular part of such funds the expenses incurred by the Society from time to time including all expenses incidental to the formation of the Society and management and administration of any of the foregoing objects including all rents, taxes, outgoings of salaries of the employees;
- w. Carry out such other duties as may be imposed upon it by the Central Government from time to time.

5.2 ADMISSIONS TO B.SC.PROGRAMME IN HOSPITALITY AND HOTEL ADMINISTRATION FOR ACADEMIC SESSION 2012-13:

National Council conducted Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) on all India basis on 28th April 2012 at 44 examination centers spread across 33 cities of the country for admission to First Year of 3-year B.Sc. Hospitality and Hotel Administration for 2012-13 academic session. Total 15215 applications were received by NCHMCT as on close of last date of receipt of application i.e. 13.04.2012. On-line on-campus counselling was held from 13th to 30th June 2012 with the help of NIC to fill 7741 seats at 50 affiliated Institutes, which includes reservation of 27% for OBC (at Central Govt. IHMs only); 15% for SC; 7½% for ST and 3% for PH Categories. On-line counselling was held at 14 IHMs viz., Pusa (New Delhi); Delhi (Lajpat Nagar); Mumbai; Chandigarh; Chennai; Kolkata; Hyderabad, Jaipur, Bhopal; Guwahati; Gwalior; Hajipur, Dehradun and Lucknow. Earlier to that, NIC also provided facility of 'Mock Counseling (on-line, off campus)" to familiarize the candidates them about real time counseling. After third round of the on-line counselling, 5353 candidates were admitted whereas through direct admission process, 608 candidates were admitted to the program. The session commenced on 01.08. 2012.

5.3 ADMISSION TO OTHER COURSES:

Admission to M.Sc. in Hospitality Administration is centrally carried out by the Council. In the case of other courses i.e. P.G. Diploma in Accommodation Operation; Diploma in Food Production; Diploma in Food & Beverage Service; Diploma in House Keeping Operation; Diploma in Front Office Operation; Diploma in Bakery & Confectionery; Craftsmanship Course in Food Production; Craftsmanship Course in Food & Beverage Service, admissions is directly carried out by the respective Institutes as per eligibility criteria prescribed by the National Council for each of the Course.

5.4 AFFILIATION OF STATE GOVERNMENT INSTITUTES

During the year under review, National Council has granted affiliation to following State Institutes of Hotel Management for offering B.Sc. Degree and other Diploma/Craft Courses from 2012-13 academic session.

6.2 SPECIAL DIPLOMA EXAMINATION HELD AT INS HAMLA

7. MoU with IGNOU was renewed for M.Sc. and B.Sc. program for a further period of five years on 11.12.12.

The NCHMCT and IGNOU signed an initial MoU in the year 2002 for award of Degree for M.Sc. and B.Sc. programs. In view to extend the successful implementation of the programs, the MoU was renewed between the two organizations for another period of five years. A formal ceremony was organized in the office of Hon'ble Minister of state for Tourism independent change on 11.12. 2012 where senior officials of both the organizations were present including member of Media.

8. MoU with INS – Hamla was renewed on 01.09.12 for Diploma Courses for a period of five years.

NCHMCT has been conducting Special Diploma Examinations in the area of Food Production and Food & Beverage Service for the Petty Officers/Sailors etc. of Indian Navy through INS Hamla. For smooth conduct of examinations, IHM, Mumbai has been nominated as Mentor Institute. The Indian Navy renewed its trust with the NCHMCT conduct of the two courses resulting in fresh signing of MoU between the two organizations on 01.09.2012 for another period of five years.

- 9. Under broadbasing of hospitality education, several new initiatives adopted including introduction of hospitality courses in CBSE schools at +2 stage of vocational stream in the trades of Food Production and Food & Beverage Service.
- (i) CBSE has targeted to introduce Hospitality related courses at +2 level at 100 CBSE schools across India for the year 2012-2013.
- (ii) For the benefit of schools, Orientation program for Principals and faculty of schools, introducing the hospitality courses, was conducted from 28th to 30th January 2013 at Delhi Institute of Hotel Management, Lajpat Nagar, New Delhi. In all, 40 participants benefited from the program which was conducted by Resource Persons from IHMs.
- (iii) Two new trades were introduced viz. Bakery & Confectionery and Front Office from the academic year 2012-2013. Text-books and study materials for the new two trades is under preparation by expert from IHMs.



10. Hunar Se Rozgar Scheme Tak extended to State Tourism Development Corporations to derive benefits at grassroot level. Orientation program conducted for STDCs of 12 States.

In order to have greater reach and provide employable skills to unemployed youth, the HSR Tak program was extended to State Tourism Development Corporations in the country. Train-the-trainer programs for twelve STDCs was conducted by NCHMCT at Chandigarh. It is envisaged that the HSRT program would be delivered by individual STDCs through their units, located at different far-flung areas of each state so that the local population can be targeted.

11. Programs for Cooks of CISF and CRPF conducted by NCHMCT.

NCHMCT had conducted training program for Central Industrial Security Force – CISF at the level of Mess Cooks – III for their Jawans at different locations. In all, six IHMs conducted the training program for 25 candidates each. The 8-weeks program of 6-days a week was delivered resulting in 250 trained cooks.

Similarly, training programs was conducted for Central Reserve Police Force – CRPF at the level of Cooks. The objective of the program was to provide basic training and certification to CRPS employees who are due for release from the force so that they acquire gainful employment upon retirement.

- 12. Term-End Examinations conducted for 12000 students during November 2012 in 10 different affiliated courses of the NCHMCT.
- (a) NCHMCT conducted Term-End examinations for ten different affiliated courses for approximately 12000 students during ODD Term-End Examinations, held in November 2012.
- (b) Similarly, NCHMCT Term-End examinations conducted ten different affiliated courses during EVEN Term-End Examinations held in May 2013.

13. Academic Audit:

In order to bring about standardization in the delivery of curriculum prescribed by NCHMCT, for the first time, Academic Audit of select institutes was conducted. Different teams visited select institutes to guide them in the expectations of the NCHMCT viz. academic requirements, especially relating to conduct of internal examination. The activity proved to be of immense benefit not only to NCHMCT but also the inspected institutes who were familiarized with the processes and systems.

14. Centralised evaluation:

For the first time, the NCHMCT conducted centralised evaluation at its NOIDA headquarters comprising the entire teams of each semester. In view of the facilities now available, this activity could be undertaken comprising housing at NCHMCT guest house and neighbouring facilities. This activity has resulted in speedy preparation and declaration of results.
