



**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR HOTEL MANAGEMENT AND CATERING TECHNOLOGY
(MINISTRY OF TOURISM, GOVT. OF INDIA), NOIDA
AND
JAWAHARLAL NEHRU UNIVERSITY, NEW DELHI**

The National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Noida (hereinafter referred to as NCHMCT), the **First Party** AND Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, (hereinafter referred to as JNU), the **Second Party**, both of them hereinafter singularly referred to as "the Party" and collectively referred to as "the Parties";

DESIRING to enhance understanding and excellence by promoting exchange and cooperation in the area of academics and research have agreed institutional collaboration in education through sharing experiences, best practices and knowledge with the primary objective to promote and strengthen the academic co-operation, aiming to enhance the management and research collaboration in the areas of national interest.

RECOGNISING the need to share value of academic cooperation and having agreed to further continue their common interests in promoting the mutual cooperation in the area of academics and research activities at NCHMCT, Noida;

PURSUANT to the prevailing laws and regulations;

HAVE reached the following understanding:

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Article 1

Objective

The objective of this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as the "MoU") is to establish framework for cooperative institutional relations to encourage and promote cooperation in the area of the academics and hospitality and hotel administration.

Article 2

Areas of co-operation

The Parties will endeavour to carry out the following exchanges and cooperative activities under this MoU which consist of:

1. the award of degree of Bachelors Programme in Hospitality & Hotel Administration and Masters Programme in Hospitality Administration to Students of the National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology (NCHMCT) by Second Party;
2. the exchange of faculties in the areas of Hospitality & Hotel Administration;
3. exchange of best practices in the area of training and development; and
4. any other exchanges and cooperative activities that may be jointly decided upon by the Parties to further the objectives of this MoU.

Article 3

Implementation

1. The Parties shall hold periodical consultations as deemed necessary for implementing this MoU;
2. For implementation of this MoU, the Parties shall designate one nodal person, each, within one month of the entry into force of this MoU to draw up the procedures, plans and recommend programmes of cooperation with a view to achieving the objectives of the MoU;

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3. Specific details of procedures and programmes for exchange and cooperative activities will be decided in a manner to be separately agreed upon by the Parties;
4. This MoU may be amended at any time by written mutual consent of both the parties;
5. This MoU may be terminated by either party by the provision of written notice of termination not less than six months prior to the desired termination date. However, both parties agree that all continuing obligations to the students, staff, funding bodies or other entities are met in full subsequent to the notice of termination;
6. The termination of this MoU shall not affect the rights or obligations of either party regarding any binding offer of firm obligations approved and agreed to by either party prior to the termination date.

Article 4

Settlement of Differences

If any provision of this Memorandum is held by any court or other competent authority to be illegal, void or unenforceable in whole or in part, this MoU shall continue to be valid as to the other provisions thereof and the remainder of the affected provisions. Any differences arising out of the interpretation, application and implementation of this MoU shall be settled amicably through consultations and negotiations. However, in case the dispute remains unresolved it shall be referred to an Arbitrator to be appointed by mutual consent of both the parties subject to the inclusive Jurisdiction of Civil Court at Delhi. The decision of the Arbitrator shall be final and binding upon both the parties.

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Article 5

Amendment

This MoU can be reviewed or amended at any time by mutual written consent by the Parties. Such reviews or amendments shall enter into force on such date as may be determined by the Parties and shall form an integral part of this MoU.

Article 6

Entry into Force, Duration, and Termination

1. This MoU shall come into force from the date of its signing;
2. This MoU shall remain in force for a period of five years and thereafter it will be renewable with the mutual written consent of the Parties;
3. Either Party may terminate this MoU at any time by giving written notification at least six months prior to the intended date of termination;
4. The Termination of this MoU shall not affect the validity and duration of any on-going programmes or activities made prior to the termination of this MoU until the completion of such programmes or activities.
